Belfast

At a number of locations across the city roads were blocked by protesters - around 50 people at each point. In some cases small barricades were erected. A few incidents of stone throwing at police. 2 hijackings and a few petrol bombing incidents.

Portadown

Several hundred protesters remain at the Portadown flash point.

A number of missiles thrown at RUC. Protesters broke through first police cordon, were contained at second. 24 PRBs fired. 4 RUC officers injured.

0500 hrs approx 2-300 Garvaghy Road residents are protesting against a suggestion that the Orange parade would walk down Garvaghy Road. Stand-off situation returns with approx 5-600 Orangemen.

Some damage to town centre caused by a crowd roaming the streets.

Londonderry

2 vehicles hijacked at New Buildings - police fired a small number of PBRs. Around 50 people roaming around Fountain Estate.

Larne

Lorries have totally blocked off all roads into Larne.

Elsewhere

Across the Province there were numerous reports of sporadic violence and roads being blocked by crowds of approx 50 people at each blockade. Sporadic violence in some areas.

Bus burned in Carrickfergus.

Bushmills - 6 PBRs fired at rampaging crowd. 2 arrested.

Ahoghill - 2 PBRs fired at rampaging crowd - no arrests. 1 RUC officer injured.
