Dear Lord Melchett,

At a recent meeting of the Executive Committee of the Ulster Unionist Council a paper prepared by the Education Policy Committee of the party on Comprehensive Education was discussed and its recommendations These are as follows:were agreed.

- 1. The Government should be pressed to delay a decision on the Cowan Report to allow adequate discussion and a balanced weighing of opinion.
- 2. The responsibility for Education in Northern Ireland should be for a devolved government in order to examine the full nature, scope and costing involved.
- 3. The simplistic scrapping of the Eleven Plus without an objective alternative is queried though the Ulster Unionist Party recognises and accepts the need for a change.
- 4. More relevant work should be devised for non-academic students who should be encouraged to remain at school until they obtain employment.
- 5. The party favours a system of comprehensive education rather than a system of comprehensive schools.
  - 6. The party believes the welfare of each child to be important and therefore rejects mere equalisation and would seek to develop educational facilities for the greatest potential of each child.
  - 7. The party supports the continuing evolution of our educational system rather than its possible destruction by a revolutionary approach.
  - 8. Names for Secondary Schools might well be changed to obviate unnecessary slurs, and the status of "Intermediate" could be raised by a more generous points system for the employment of ancillary staff.
  - 9. The party believes that the best traditions of the Grammar Schools have a part to play in capitalising our greatest natural resources - boys and girls, but believes that an inequitable distribution of financial resources in favour of a few schools might militate against this.

We were asked to convey these recommendations, reached after considerable thought by a widely representative Education Committee and endorsed by the policymaking body of the whole party, to you as urgently and forcefully as possible.
